

### On "What Do We Have to Eat?"

When I was a kid, I was hungry all the time, and this has pretty much followed me around. I don't always give in to it, however, as I subscribe to something I heard or read once...that it's good to always be a little bit hungry. Which is not to say that I haven't pushed back from any given meal for having eaten too much. But seems I could never eat too much when I was small, and what I recall specifically is bursting into the house after playing outside and asking Mom, "What do we have to eat?"

She'd offer me this or that or any number of things, and oftentimes, I declined. For example, say, "Do you want yogurt and fruit cocktail?" Nah. "Do you want a peanut butter and jelly sandwich?" Nah. "Bologna?" Nah. "Left-over pork chops and rice?" Nah. Eventually, we both tired of the game, with Mom usually launching the first salvo: "Well, you must not be very hungry, then." I'd mope around for a while before having one—and sometimes all—of my mother's offerings.

And another eating-related thing I remember from those long-ago days is Cracker Jack. Mom didn't treat me often with this. Plain vogurt and canned fruit cocktail was much more available to me. But when she served up Cracker Jack, I remember always liking the peanuts more than the candy-coated popcorn, and I remember always wondering if this was because there were so few peanuts compared to popcorn. It's funny how an 8year-old thinks things through. And of course, I remember the jingle. Not all of it, but most of it. I remember the main verse like it was yesterday: "Whadda you want/ When you gotta eat

somethin'/ And it's gotta be sweet/ And it's gotta be a lot/ And you gotta have it now... Whadda you want?" And I remember the end of the rhyme the same: "Candycoated popcorn, peanuts and a prize/ That's what you get in Cracker Jack."

of those "lip-smackin'" inner rhymes are lost on me. Rap, ahead of its time.

But these Whadda want/ Whadda have to eat questions surface today as I consider the Gospel, Luke's account of Jesus's post-Resurrection appearance to his disciples. Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John all have their own version, and each tells of Jesus commissioning his friends to go forth. But only Luke has one of my two favorite details in the entire Book. The first is John telling us, "And Jesus wept" outside of Lazarus's tomb. And today, it's Luke recording of Jesus asking his terrified friends (who think they are seeing a ghost), "Have you anything here to eat?"

I love this. Per the footnote in my book about these verses of Jesus showing the disciples his hands and feet and them asking for something to eat, "The apologetic purpose of this story is evident in the concern with the physical details and the report that Jesus ate food." Because it's all very unghostlike, I guess. But Jesus's question runs deeper to me, the guy who grew up asking "What do we have to eat?" It speaks intensely to my ear of Jesus's human-ness (just like his weeping at a friend's tomb). And yet at the very same time, I have come to believe that this Jesus is the Christ, the Bread of Life come down from heaven. Which prompts me all the more to ask the question, and this time in a divine context: Hey, Jesus! Have you anything here to eat?


#### Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

#### The Twist Ending

Any reader of psychological thrillers will come across the "dead main character trope" fairly often. This is the famous Sixth Sense twist ending (I would say "spoiler alert," but the movie is older than most of the people who work in Youth Ministry at your archdiocese, so you've probably seen it by now) where the reader finds that the main character has been dead for all or most of the story.

I'm always a little disappointed when this happens. It delivers shock value, sure, but it also undermines everything that happens in the story. You've come on a journey with this character, only to find out that nothing you saw transpire was real in the way you thought it was. You feel a little stupid, because the whole time you only had part of the truth.

I suspect Jesus knows this about us. He knows we don't like to have the rug pulled out. It's why he is so up-front about his humanity following the resurrection. See how Jesus, resurrected, shows the disciples his feet, his hands. See how he asks them for food and lets them watch him eat it. See how this creates in them an understanding, a belief.

The humanity of Jesus Christ is absolutely crucial. It's what bridges the divide between the sons of Eve and the God she defied. Our reconciliation with God cannot happen unless human flesh pays the price that will balance the scales. Human flesh: skin that can tear and bleed, bones that can break, a mouth that can thirst, a stomach that can ache with hunger.

The passion and death of Jesus Christ is not a thriller with a twist ending: *he was a ghost the whole time!* The twist, if anything, is this: he was human the whole time.

#### Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained


#### **Question:**

I've heard that we become angels when we die. Is this what the Church teaches?

#### Answer:

As human beings, we are both spiritual and corporeal. We are body and soul. This makes us unique in all creation. No other physical creature — plant or animal — possesses an immortal soul made in God's image and likeness. Like the distinction with plants and animals, angels have an entirely different sort of existence. Angels are pure immortal spirit, and they have been so since the moment of their creation. While they may take on an appearance of a body in Biblical history, they are not a body like we are. Angels are neither male nor female, despite the art we often see.

As the result of the Fall, human beings experience death. Our souls are temporarily separated from our bodies. However, we do not become something other than human. Every Sunday in the Creed we profess "I believe in the resurrection of the body." As Jesus was united with his body on the third day, so too will we be united with our bodies at the end of time.



## **Respect** Life News

#### Top Reasons to Oppose Assisted Suicide:

## No psychiatric evaluation or treatment is required; patients with depression qualify for assisted suicide.

• Despite medical literature showing that nearly 95 percent of those who commit suicide had a diagnosable psychiatric illness (usually treatable depression) in the months preceding suicide, the prescribing doctor and the doctor he or she selects to give a second opinion are both free to decide whether to refer suicidal patients for any psychological evaluation. Per Oregon's official annual report, from 2013— 2016 less than 4% of patients who died under its assisted suicide law had been referred for evaluations to check for "impaired judgment."

• If an evaluation is provided to suicidal patients, its goal is not to treat the underlying psychopathology, but to determine that the patient is not suffering from "a psychiatric or psychological disorder or depression causing impaired judgment." The doctors or counselor can decide that, since depression is "a completely normal response" to terminal illness, the depressed patient's judgment is not impaired.

• Assisted suicide laws place lethal drugs in patients' hands to be administered at a time of their choosing, making it impossible to determine whether their judgment is impaired when the actual decision for suicide is made and the drugs are taken. Assisted suicide threatens improved palliative care.

• There is compelling evidence that legalizing assisted suicide undermines efforts to maintain and improve good care for patients nearing the end of life, including patients who never wanted assisted suicide.

• Vermont legalized physician-assisted suicide in 2013. In 2015, the state's Visiting Nurse Association announced it is conducting a study to discover why the state has "the third lowest hospice utilization rate in the nation."


