On The Ascension (or Not), and Missing our Moms

I was out for some long miles through the Caldwell and Devon woods shortly before Easter when I came upon another runner on the path. Technically, she came upon me. I had pressed the button on the traffic device where the path crosses Touhy to get the WALK sign before proceeding. I tend these days to cross only with the light, for I've seen way too many drivers ignore way too many signals and general rules of the road. With the right-ofway on my side, I figure I have a better chance...

The runner behind me either shared my mindset or was deferring to the senior citizen in front of her, for even though there were no cars coming in either direction for quite a distance, she stood there

with me awaiting the WALK. I alluded to the oncoming cars—still a ways off—and said, "I don't trust any of them!" She acknowledged my concern, and shared a quick bad—driver story. Then the light changed and we took off together, chatting as we went.

I asked her about her mileage that day. She asked me about mine. We talked about work. We talked about family. Small talk. But when I asked her if she had big Easter plans, the conversation got heavier. She said she was celebrating, but only at home with her husband and children. She said that her mom died last year, and that the large family gatherings within her clan that used to be so much fun are now just too hard to bear. Unintentionally,

I had invited sadness along for the miles.


To keep her company, I told her that when my mom died in 1995, I learned about the significance of one good woman in the world. Even though I was long-married and living in Chicago with my wife and family by then, Mom's death prompted me to cry nearly all the way back to Streator for the funeral, where so many people told me of the impact my mom had on their lives with a word, a smile, a pie.

In Isaiah, God compares his love for his people

in motherly terms ("Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb?"). And Jesus himself uses a maternal simile in lamenting over those who do not embrace God and all God represents ("Jerusalem, Jerusalem, you who kill the prophets and stone those sent to you, how many times I yearned to gather your children together as a hen gathers her young under her wings").

Certainly the disciples in that locked room after Jesus died felt sad. alone, and confused with their old friend gone. And given the imagery above, perhaps they felt a bit like my new friend on the running path that day missing her mom, or perhaps a bit like me in 1995 crying all the way home. I'm not even sure if the Eleven felt any better after Jesus ascends. Or doesn't ascend. After all, per today's "Long Ending" to Mark's Gospel, Jesus is "taken up into heaven," but the original ending is absolutely Ascension-less. As is Matthew's account. As is John's account, other than an Ascension reference spoken by Jesus to Mary Magdalene near the empty tomb. Nonetheless, the disciples can take comfort knowing that Jesus is with them always, even until the end of the age. And my friend on the path and I can take comfort knowing that the same goes for a good woman's love. Happy Mother's Day.



The Truth We Cannot See

I only pray out loud when I want my kids to hear what I'm saying.

I know what you're thinking — hypocrites in the synagogue and the street corner; go to your room and shut the door — but I think if Jesus had to raise children he would understand where I'm coming from. I pray out loud not because I want my kids to think I'm holy and not because I want them to admire me but because I want them to know how broken I am, how desperately I rely on the mercy and love of God.

It's also a really effective way to send a message. "God, I'm sorry I've been losing my patience today. Please help me. And send your Holy Spirit to make these kids stop fighting."

Vocal prayer, in front of other people, is an incredibly vulnerable action, so it strikes me whenever Jesus chooses to pray out loud in front of his disciples. Surely, mental prayer was something of a perpetual state for him. I imagine Jesus was ceaselessly in conversation with his Father in heaven throughout even the most ordinary of days. So, when he chooses to make those communications public, my ears perk up.

He wants his kids to hear what he's saying.

In John, chapter 17, we see that he wants us to remember who we are. His disciples are about to see things that will shake the very foundations of their faith. The only way they will make it to the other side is if they remember that truth does not consist only of what we can see with our eyes.

This is the same truth in which we have been consecrated. We belong to this truth in a way the world will never understand or accept. It is the truth we cannot see.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

Answer:

This is an interesting question! During his earthly life. Jesus gave sight to the blind. healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and he is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good he does here on earth!



Respect Life News

Parishioners GoPublic4Life! On April 6, several parishioners joined in the peaceful ecumenical

GoPublic4Life Prayer Vigil near the Planned Parenthood on Chicago Avenue. The Vigil consisted of 30 minutes of song, 30 minutes of prayer, and 30 minutes



of silence. GoPublic4Life is a statewide vigil held simultaneously near numerous abortion clinic. Participants peacefully pray for an end to abortion. Hundreds of pro-lifers took part across the state in the late summer and again on April 6. The vigils allow average pro-life Christians to show their support for the Church's teaching that all life is sacred. GoPublic4Life hopes that Illinoisans will again support the right to life and dignity for all people, from conception to natural death. We have also emphasized vigils near abortion facilities that are located in communities which the abortion industry has historically targeted but which the pro-life community has under-served, such as the west side of Chicago.


