Spirit of Thanksgiving This Thursday we celebrate Thanksgiving

Day. It is a special day on which our forebears stopped their activities to give thanks to God for all that they had been given, especially the land and the produce from the land. Please join us in celebrating a Thanksgiving Mass on Wednesday evening at 7 PM at St. Cyprian and at 9 AM on Thursday at St. Celestine.

We give thanks to the Lord for the many blessings that He has bestowed upon us. Thanksgiving is not an added extra. It is absolutely central to the life of a Christian. Without a spirit of thanksgiving our Christian lives would be cold and lifeless. An attitude of mind in which thankfulness has no part is likely to lead to pettiness, resentment, and cynicism. Thankfulness, on the other hand, preserves a right relationship with God. If we're thankful, God is necessarily part of our lives. God doesn't need our thanks, but we need to thank God as in the Preface in the Roman Missal: "For, although You (God) have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness but profit us for salvation, through Christ our Lord." It reminds us that everything we have, we owe to him. It's easy to be grateful to God for the good things that happen to us. But we must try to be grateful for all of our livesthe bad as well as the good, the

sorrows and the joys, the failures and successes. This is no easy task. We can truly call ourselves grateful people only when we can say thanks for everything that has brought us to this moment. We need to give thanks to God everywhere and every time. Thanksgiving, when it is an attitude of life, becomes "thanks-living—living in gratitude; living with a thankful heart. Thanksgiving, as a way of life, also means "thanks" to God and "giving to others. As we celebrate Thanksgiving, we have many things to be thankful for—for our life, our parents, our families and friends, our work, and our future life together.

On Marathons, and Talents

I had a long talk with God on October 7. It's my intention to chat with him every day, but I don't always pull it off. And even when I do. the conversations tend to be short. You know. "Hev. How's it going? Thanks. Sorry." This sort of thing. But on October 7, I had a little additional quiet time, so I kept the conversation going. Specifically, I was running the Gandy-Dancer Trail Marathon up in Luck, Wisconsin. Only 200 runners (compared to the 45,000+ that ran the Chicago Marathon the next day) and not many spectators. Yeah. Lots of quiet time.

Early on, I simply thanked



God for the day. Runningwise, the weather was perfect. Upper 30s at the 7:00 AM start, upper 50s by mid-day. The skies were mostly cloudy but they brightened as the miles fell away. The tree cover up and down the trail didn't allow the wind-albeit gentle-to have much impact on the run. Additionally, this same tree cover didn't let the emerging sunshine become troublesome either. And with many of the leaves just then changing into their autumnal best, there were a lot of picture postcard pics waiting to be snapped.

Of course, I had no time for snapping picture postcard

pics. I wanted to go sub-4 hours and 20 minutes. I really wanted to go sub-4:15, and I was on pace for this through eighteen miles or so, but then I could feel the pace wanting to slip away. It hadn't slipped away yet, though, so I got a little more needy in my God-ly conversation. I started asking God to give me just one more mile like the last one. Minutes-permile-wise, I was running 9:45s at that point (per the plan), so each time I logged another one, I asked God for just one more. And one more. And one more...

And this is when I got even more needy. I quoted Eric Liddell from Chariots of Fire: "I believe God made me for a purpose, but he also made me fast, and when I run, I feel his pleasure" because it led directly to my next level of neediness, where I put it all right back on God (and quite reasonably, I believe). God put it in me to run after all, so I was just living out the gift. "Look God," I said (more or less), "I'm struggling here, but I'm only out here because you made me a runner. I could be home having coffee, but I'm out here using the longdistance legs and lungs... the long-distance gift—you gave me. So, a little help here, please?" I finished strong.

Today we hear Jesus's parable of the talents: "A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one-to each according to his ability." At my desk I keep Pope Pius X's prayer to St. Joseph. After asking Joseph's help in acquiring the grace to work earnestly, the prayer directs me to keep "death before my eyes and the account that I must render of time lost, of talents wasted..." With many miles behind me, I pray I've used my long-distance gift well. Other talents, though, I know I've wasted.

The one-talent servant tells his master, "out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here it is back." We are all talent-ed, but none of us know the final distance put before us. Here's to running the good race, then. To finishing strong. To not burying our talents along the way.



What Remains

When my grandfather died, my parents, siblings, and I were left with the question: what's to become of the house?

Anyone who has inherited property knows that it's not simply a matter of assuming ownership of a plot of land upon which sits four walls and a roof. Those four walls and a roof usually contain memories and objects — an enormous volume of both, in the case of my grandfather. When they're left to you, you have to sift through them, the memories and the objects, and with each one you have to think: *Is it worth it? Do I keep it?*Will I need it?

And slowly, painfully, you disassemble the physical existence of the person who lived here. You accept, with a pang, that most of it must be given away or discarded. You cry when you bag up the clothes to take to Goodwill. You can't even bear to look when they break the piano into a hundred pieces and throw it in a dumpster, realizing that no one wants or has a use for something that was once so precious.

But when you come upon a rosary that was used so many times it has begun to fall apart, you don't even think twice before keeping it, and not because you need the rosary. You need what it means. You need what it reminds you of.

When all is said and done, each of us will be called before our master to settle accounts, just as my grandfather was.

"Where are the gifts I gave you? What remains of the fortune to which I entrusted you?" he will ask us. "What have you done with the peace? What have you done with the love? What have you done with the mercy?"

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

If it isn't only for people who are dying, when should someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

Answer:

One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction."

In his life and ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage. And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and the elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed.

The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting that the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).




Taizé is a simple service of prayer, music, reflections, and the Word.




